Bishal Gyawali, MD, PhD is a medical oncologist with work experience in various low- and high- income countries. He graduated medical school in Nepal with seven gold medals and received his PhD from Nagoya University, Japan as a MEXT scholar. He then practiced as a medical oncologist at Civil Service Hospital, Kathmandu, Nepal and later joined the Program On Regulation, Therapeutics and Law in the Department of Medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital and Harvard Medical School as a research fellow in cancer policy and biomarkers where he is now an adjunct faculty. Currently, he is a medical oncologist and scientist in the Division of Cancer Care and Epidemiology at the Queen's University Cancer Research Institute where he is also an Assistant Professor in the Department of Public Health Sciences. He serves as a medical consultant for the not-for-profit Anticancer Fund, Belgium, as editorial and advisory board members for *ecancer*, editorial advisor for the *BMJ* and as a peer reviewer for *JAMA Internal Medicine*, *JAMA Oncology*, *BMJ*, *Annals of Internal Medicine*, *JNCI*, *JNCCN*, *Annals of Oncology* among others. His areas of clinical and research interests include cancer policy, global oncology, evidence-based oncology, financial toxicities of cancer treatment, clinical trial methods, and supportive care. He is an advocate of "[cancer groundshot](#)", a term he coined to imply that investment should be made on known high-value interventions in cancer care that are easy to implement globally and are affordable.
